Combine it all
together . . . YES, really!

It's OK to CO-MINGLE!

- Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, phone books
- Office paper, colored paper, notepads, letters, paper bags
- Shredded paper in a paper bag (less mess)
- Cereal and cracker style boxes (flattened, liner removed)
- Cardboard tubes, milk cartons and juice boxes (rinsed)
- Plastic bottles with a neck (rinsed, discard lids)...like water, beverages, milk jugs, shampoo, detergent, cleanser
- Plastic tubs 6 oz. to 5 gallons in size (cleaned, discard lids) like dairy products, cat litter, detergent



- Plant containers 4 inches and larger (cleaned)
- Aluminum cans and tin cans (rinsed & flattened)
- Clean aluminum foil
- Empty aerosol cans (discard cap)



Keep these items
SEPARATE



- Glass bottles and jars (rinsed, discard lids)
- Corrugated cardboard boxes (flattened)

Please...NO clear "clamshells" or styrofoam

What else?

- Plastic bags . . . take back to the grocery store for recycling
- Make compost . . . fruit & vegetable scraps, paper towels & napkins, weeds, lawn clippings and leaves
