Combine it all together...YES, really!

- Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, phone books



- Office paper, colored paper, notepads, letters, paper bags
- Shredded paper in a paper bag (less mess)

- Tissue, shoe, cookie, cereal and cracker style boxes (liner removed)

- Cardboard tubes, milk cartons and juice boxes (rinsed)



- Plastic bottles with a neck



(rinsed, discard lids)...like water, beverages, milk jugs, shampoo, detergent, cleanser

- Plastic tubs 6 oz. to 5 gallons in size (cleaned, discard lids)...like dairy products, cat litter, detergent



- Plant containers 4 inches and larger (cleaned)



- Aluminum cans and tin cans (rinsed)
- Clean aluminum foil
- Empty aerosol cans (discard cap)



It's OK to CO-MINGLE!

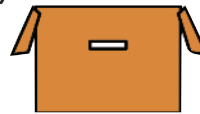
Keep these items SEPARATE

On the side please

- Glass bottles and jars (rinsed, discard lids)



- Corrugated cardboard boxes (flattened)



What else?

- Plastic shopping bags...take back to the grocery store for recycling
- Make compost... fruit & vegetable scraps, paper towels & napkins, weeds, lawn clippings and leaves



Please...NO clear "clamshells" or styrofoam

Household Hazardous WASTE

Save for the next free collection in your area:



- OIL-BASED paints and stains (not latex, it is not toxic)
- Pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers
- Household cleansers and chemicals
- Antifreeze, brake fluids, old gas & kerosene (not motor oil)
- Propane bottles and tanks
- Dry cell and lithium batteries
- Fluorescent bulbs and CFL bulbs
- Thermometers & thermostats
- Fire extinguishers
